A poll of the AMAC community found that an overwhelming majority of members supported the creation of a charitable foundation to serve the information needs of older Americans, specifically those concerning Medicare, Social Security, and health care in general. With that as a directive, we moved ahead in 2013 with the formation of the AMAC Foundation, creating a 501(c)(3) entity to serve as a source of guidance to those on the threshold of retirement, to those already in their retirement years, and to those taking a long-range look at future retirement. Foundation Services

In addition to this vital service, the Foundation also operates two information-packed websites (SocialSecurityReport.org and MedicareReport.org) designed to keep the public updated on these two critically important areas. The searchable sites are updated daily, and contain history and program documentation, along with breaking news about the programs.
